 - i. Asst Dean of Students spearheaded process and teachers raised over 3K to pay for the food and to have it catered.
 - ii. Cookies with Santa scheduled for Dec 22nd
 - iii. Whole Team was Narcan trained and there is narcan on site
- c. Hiring-Added a new Assistant Dean of students who will also help with teaching
 - Francine Tucker is new Assistant Dean of Students, in charge of K-2 culture team
 - ii. Not getting quality Sped instructional candidates. If no person found by Dec, 15, not going to be filled by this School year

- i. Second Phase in STEP testing underway
 - 1. Reviewing new student data sources and being responsive

- iii. DRCS is a managed instruction model- Teachers have to demonstrate that they can work within the instructional system. Challenging at first but if successful, model will become Performance Based Autonomy Model giving teachers more flexibility
- iv. Trying to give internal systems of teachers and staff ways to mentor and interact w/o direct leadership

- i. Facility: Still learning the building
 - 1. Chipping away at repairs
 - 2. Working on refining operations and systems
- ii. Transportation issues
 - 1. Pressure on Transport companies to drop off on time
 - a. Significant delays with one bus
 - b. JH suggests connecting with Dan Bell from Mastery
 - 2. Departure is less of an issue
- iii. Enrollment 303 as of 12/3, budget is based on 285
 - 1. Not sure from when CSO is going to reconcile
 - a. Short term hit unless they wait until we reconcile Spec-ed pop
 - 2. Asked district to offset costs to rectify costs of all spec-ed kids who weren't in compliance or compel prior schools to give us IEPS
- iv. Financial management
 - 1. Long term good, short term challenged because of no overflow balance from previous year
 - 2. November was change from projection payments to actuals
 - 3. Current SPED number is lower than projections however as students continue to work through evaluations, we will end up above projections and funds will return
- v. Financial Statement Review (Kevin)
 - 1. SEE BALANCE SHEET PACKET
 - 2. Budget is based on 41 SPED, current is 26, EXPECTED is 51
 - 3. Short term: Deal with cash flow crunch
 - 4. Long term: Stay positive by End of Year, keep 4 of 5 metrics in green or yellow (Days cash on hand likely below target of 60)
